Falconer Museum talks

The treasures that make up the Falconer Museum collection in Forres will be the subject of two talks by museum staff next week.

As well as a short film on the museum's founder, the Victorian geologist and palaeontologist Dr Hugh Falconer, the talks will include a selection of 'mystery objects' from the vast collection.

The presentations will take place at Dufftown library on Wednesday, November 2 at 3pm and at Forres library on Thursday, November 3 at 7pm by museum officers Liz Trevethick and Anne Owen. Both events are free.
